Application Review

Gregg Stouder – NCARB Endorsement, Section 481.213(3)(c), F.S.

Mr. Stouder's application was before the board based on prior disciplinary action. He was previously licensed in Florida and was selected for the continuing education audit in 2007. Mr. Stouder was issued a citation for failing to respond to the audit. He responded to a citation but was not able to document proof of completing the continuing education required for renewal in 2007. He voluntarily relinquished his license in lieu of further disciplinary action.

Mr. Stouder was present and provided a brief synopsis for voluntarily relinquishing his prior license and the need to regain licensure.

After review and discussion the board made the following motion.

Motion: Mr. Rodriguez moved that the board approve the application and impose a \$500 citation penalty plus \$24 costs to be paid within 30 days and 24 hours of continuing education as a condition of licensure.

Second: Ms. Fishburne seconded the motion.

The question was called and the motion failed.

Motion: Mr. Ehrig moved that the board approve the application and impose a \$500 citation penalty, \$1,000 fine plus \$24 costs to be paid within 30 days, and 24 hours continuing education as a condition of licensure.

Second: Mr. Costoya seconded the motion it passed with Mr. Rodriguez and Ms. Fishburne opposed.

Petition for Variance or Waiver from Rule 61G1-14.001, Florida Administrative Code

Leopold Paul Zajfen – Petition and Application Review

Mr. Zajfen was present and provided a brief synopsis of his petition.

The petition was filed on April 28, 2016. Mr. Zajfen applied for licensure by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) Endorsement route per Section 481.213(3) (c), Florida Statutes. Mr. Zajfen did not take and pass the prescribed licensure examination as required by board rule; however, he took and passed the prescribed examinations of the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) and the professional practice and legislative examination administered in the Province of Quebec, Canada.

Mr. Zajfen is licensed in United Kingdom, the Canadian Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, Canada, is licensed in more thirteen states in the United States where they determined his credentials, including the examination, as substantially equivalent for licensure, he has practiced as a licensed architect in Canada since 1972 with no disciplinary actions, and he has met the rigorous review for NCARB certification.

Mr. Zajfen seeks a permanent variance from the requirement of Rule 61G1-14.001, F.A.C. based on the examinations he has passed, together with his extensive experience, his

licensure in the United States, Canada, as well as the United Kingdom and his 1979 NCARB certification through their Certification Guidelines through an Alternative to Examination Requirement.

After reviewing Mr. Zajfen's credentials the board determined that he met the minimum level of competency and standards which meets the Legislative intent to protect the public's health, safety, and welfare. After board review and discussion the following motion was made.

Motion: Mr. Ehrig moved that the board grant the waiver of the examination requirement outlined in Florida Administrative Code 61G1-14.001, that Mr. Zajfen has met the intent of the underlying statute, that requiring him to take any further examinations would be a hardship as defined in Section 120.542(2), Florida Statutes, and that the board grant the license to practice in the state of Florida.

Second: Mr. Costoya seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
