### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – BRIAN CATHEY**

Mr. Cathey gave the following report:

Mr. Cathey stated that creation of the industrial facilities specialty license was still moving forward.

Mr. Cathey informed the Board that the March 2014 meeting would take place in Jacksonville.

Mr. Cathey asked the prosecuting attorney's office to provide a note in the Board package indicating what was previously discussed when the Board has requested a case be opened.

### **PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT – KYLE CHRISTOPHER**

For the month of January 2014, the overall license activity case load was 468, up from 416 in December of 2013, and up from 323 in January 2013.

There were 271 cases currently in Legal to be reviewed, 11 cases set for probable cause, 25 cases where probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed, 1 settlement stipulation approved, 3 informal hearings requested, 9 cases awaiting outside action, 7 cases ready for default, 28 formal hearings requested, 0 cases referred to DOAH, 6 cases in settlement negotiations, 1 case pending board date, 27 cases set for board presentation, 79 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been re-opened.

For the month of January 2014, 50 cases were closed.

For the month of January 2014, the overall unlicensed activity case load was 447, up from 405 in December 2013.

There were 447 cases currently in Legal to be reviewed, 24 cases where administrative complaints has been filed, 1 settlement stipulation approved, 4 informal hearings requested, 0 cases awaiting outside action, 33 cases ready for default, 13 formal hearings requested, 0 cases referred to DOAH, 1 case in settlement negotiations, 3 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been re-opened.

For the month of January 2014, 47 cases were closed.
