EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT – Drew Winters

Mr. Winters gave the following report:

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – BRIAN CATHEY

There was no chairman's report as Mr. Cathey was absent.

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT – KYLE CHRISTOPHER

Mr. Christopher gave the following report:

For the month of May 2014, the overall license activity case load was 500, down from 504 in April 2014 and up from 289 in May 2013.

There were 320 cases currently in Legal to be reviewed, 16 cases set for probable cause, 46 cases for which probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed, 2 settlement stipulations approved, 1 informal hearing requested, 6 cases awaiting outside action, 10 cases ready for default, 34 formal hearings requested, 1 case referred to DOAH, 4 cases in settlement negotiations, 0 cases pending board dates, 29 cases set for board presentation, 30 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been re-opened.

For the month of May 2014, 127 cases were closed.

For the month of May 2014, the overall unlicensed activity case load was 664, down from 673 in April 2014.

There were 585 cases currently in Legal to be reviewed, 11 cases where administrative complaints had been filed, 1 settlement stipulation approved, 9 informal hearings requested, 0 cases awaiting outside action, 34 cases ready for default, 22 formal hearings requested, 0 cases referred to DOAH, 2 cases in settlement negotiations, 0 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been re-opened.

For the month of May 2014, 46 cases were closed.

The motion for intervention was granted by the Board.
