### **GENERAL SESSION**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Cathey, Chair, at 9:01am. Mr. Cobb gave the Invocation. Mr. Sheehan led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **DEPUTY DIVISION DIRECTOR'S REPORT – Drew Winters**

Mr. Winters gave the following report:

Mr. Winters requested the Board approve the transfer of \$500,000.00 of operating funds to the ULA deficit account. The transfer of funds was approved by the Board.

Mr. Winters requested the Board to consider allowing the Department to withdraw applications that were previously denied by the Board solely for experience should the applicant make such a request. This would alleviate the need for an applicant to attend General Session simply to request that the Board allow them to withdraw their application. Mr. Dolan advised the Board that the language could be incorporated in the Notices of Intent to Deny. Mr. Dolan also stated if there was an application where this was not acceptable to the Board, the language would not be included in that particular Notice of Intent to Deny. Division I voted to begin this process in January 2015. Division II voted to begin this process in January 2015.

With nothing further to report the Board voted unanimously to approve this report.

### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – BRIAN CATHEY**

Mr. Cathey welcomed Daniel Biggins as the new Executive Director for the Board, and congratulated Drew Winters on his promotion to Deputy Division Director.

Mr. Cathey thanked the Board for allowing him to serve as Board Chair.

With nothing further to report the Board voted unanimously to approve this report.

### **PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT – KYLE CHRISTOPHER**

Mr. Christopher gave the following report:

For the month of October 2014, the overall license activity case load was 550, down from 555 in September 2014 and up from 382 in October 2013.

There were 402 cases in Legal to be reviewed, 5 cases set for probable cause, 15 cases for which probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed, 1 settlement stipulation approved, 2 informal hearings requested, 1 case awaiting outside action, 22 cases ready for default, 55 formal hearings requested, 0 cases referred to DOAH, 1 case in settlement negotiations, 1 case pending a



Board date, 30 cases set for Board presentation, 15 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been re-opened.

For the month of October 2014, 102 cases were closed.

For the month of October 2014, the overall unlicensed activity case load was 683, down from 747 in September 2014.

There were 466 cases in Legal to be reviewed, 57 administrative complaints filed, 1 settlement stipulation approved, 12 informal hearings requested, 3 cases awaiting outside action, 68 cases ready for default, 44 formal hearings requested, 0 cases referred to DOAH, 19 cases in settlement negotiations, 13 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been re-opened.

For the month of October 2014, 154 cases were closed.

With nothing further to report the Board voted unanimously to approve this report.

### **ATTORNEY GENERAL'S REPORT – TOM BARNHART**

#### **JAMES ADAMS – PETITION FOR DECLARATORY STATEMENT**

Mr. Adams was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating that James Adams filed a petition for declaratory statement on September 30, 2014. The petition was noticed in the Florida Administrative Register on October 8, 2014. Mr. Barnhart noted the petition seeks the Board's interpretation as to whether dryer vent cleaning, using the method described in his petition, requires a mechanical contractor's license.

After discussion, the Board voted that because there is no disassembly of the dryer exhaust system in order to clean the dryer vent using the method described, a mechanical contractor's license is not necessary.

#### **BECKER ARENA PRODUCTS INC/JAMES BECKER – PETITION FOR DECLARATORY STATEMENT**

Mr. Becker was not present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating that James Becker filed a petition for declaratory statement on October 6, 2014. The petition was noticed in the Florida Administrative Register on October 9, 2014. Mr. Barnhart noted the petition seeks the Board's interpretation as to which license his company should apply for pursuant to 61G4-15, Florida Administrative Code, which would encompass the company's scope of work. None of the categories cover the scope of work that his company performs.

After discussion, the Board voted to decline issuing a declaratory statement because the request is vague and does not provide sufficient information to allow the Board to make an informed decision.

#### **LOWELL BENSON– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Benson was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Benson's application for initial issuance of a certified mechanical contractor's license was denied at the June 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the required experience, pursuant to section 489.111, Florida Statutes, and Rule 61G4-15.001, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in July of 2014. Mr. Benson timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.

#### **CITY OF ORLANDO– PETITION FOR DECLARATORY STATEMENT**

The petition for declaratory statement from the City of Orlando was withdrawn prior to the Board meeting.

#### **STEVEN CRAWFORD– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Crawford was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Crawford's application for a certified roofing contractor's license was denied at the August 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the required experience, pursuant to section 489.111, Florida Statutes, and Rule 61G4-15.001, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in September of 2014. Mr. Crawford timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to uphold the denial.

#### **AUBREY CROSBY– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Ms. Crosby was not present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Ms. Crosby's application for change of status for a certified General contractor's license was denied at the October 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate financial stability and responsibility, pursuant to section 489.115, Florida Statutes and Rule 61G4-15.006, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in October of 2014. Mrs. Crosby timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.

#### **PATRICK D'AMICO– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. D'amico was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. D'amico's application for change of status for a certified building contractor's license was denied at the May 2014 meeting of the board because the applicant has been convicted, found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere to crimes related to the practice of, or the ability to practice, contracting, contrary to section 455.227 (1)(c) and 489.129(1)(b), Florida Statutes. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in July of 2014. Mr. D'amico timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application upon proof of W2 form or 20% ownership and 6 years' probation.

### **BROOKS DONAVON – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Donavon was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Donavon application to qualify an additional business entity was denied at the October 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the qualifying agent would properly supervise the construction work and business activities, as required by section 489.119, Florida Statutes. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in October of 2014. Mr. Donavon timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.

### **LUIS ESCOBAR – RECONSIDERATION REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Escobar was not present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Escobar's application to qualify an additional business entity was denied at the July 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the qualifying agent would properly supervise the construction work and business activities, as required by section 489.119, Florida Statutes. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in July of 2014. Mr. Escobar requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.

### **JUAN FERNANDEZ– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Ms. Fernandez was present with council.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Ms. Fernandez's application for initial certified Class B Air Conditioning Contractor's license was denied at the August 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the required experience, pursuant to section 489.111, Florida Statutes, and Rule 61G4-15.001, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in September of 2014. Mrs. Fernandez timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.

### **VIC GRANOWICZ– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Ganowicz was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Ganowicz's application to qualify an additional business entity was denied at the September 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the qualifying agent would properly supervise the construction work and business activities, as required by section 489.119, Florida Statutes, the application also failed to appear as required by Rule 61G4-15.0021, Florida Administrative Code, and the applicant is involved in an open investigation and the Board may

use this as a basis for denial according to section 455.213(3), F.S.. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in October of 2014. Mr. Ganowicz requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application upon payment plan and 20% ownership or W2 form.

#### **MARIO HERNANDEZ– REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Hernandez was not present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Hernandez's application to qualify an additional business entity was denied at the August 2014 meeting of the board for failure to demonstrate the qualifying agent would properly supervise the construction work and business activities, as required by section 489.119, Florida Statutes. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in September of 2014. Mr. Hernandez timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to uphold the denial.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Morrissey's application to qualify an additional business entity was denied at the August 2014 meeting of the Board for failure to demonstrate the qualifying

agent would properly supervise the construction work and business activities, as required by section 489.119, Florida statutes and the applicant failed to appear as required by Rule 61G4-15.0021, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in September of 2014. Mr. Morrissey timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.

#### **ANGELA RAMIREZ – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Ms. Ramirez was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Ms. Ramirez's application for initial issuance of a certified general contractor's license was denied at the February 2014 meeting of the Board for failure to demonstrate the required experience, pursuant to section 489.111, Florida Statutes, and Rule 61-G4-15.001, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in March of 2014. Mrs. Ramirez timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the denial. Mrs. Ramirez subsequently withdrew her application.

#### **JAY ROSSI – REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION**

Mr. Rossi was not present, but was represented by counsel. Counsel requested a 60 day continuance on Mr. Rossi's behalf.

After discussion, the Board voted to grant the 60 day continuance.

#### **TROY RUSH– PETITION FOR VARIANCE OR WAIVER**

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating that Mr. Rush filed a petition for variance or waiver on September 29, 2014. The petition was noticed in the Florida Administrative Register on October 28, 2014. Mr. Barnhart noted the petitioner asks the Board for variance or waiver from the requirement of having to retake the Certified General Contractors for business/Finance and Contract Administration exam. Petitioner is requesting that his passing scores from December 2008 for this exam be used to continue the process, review and completion of his application.

After discussion, the Board voted to deny the request for variance or waiver because the petitioner did not demonstrate how the purpose of the underlying statute would be or has been achieved by other means by the petitioner, and the petitioner did not show how application of the rule creates a substantial hardship or violates principles of fairness.

#### **SAMUEL SAAD – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING**

Mr. Saad was present.

Mr. Barnhart presented this case stating Mr. Saad's application for initial issuance of a certified general contractor's license was denied at the August 2014 meeting of the Board for failure to demonstrate the

required experience, pursuant to section 489.111, Florida Statutes, and Rule 61-G4-15.001, Florida Administrative Code. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in September of 2014. Mr. Saad timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion, the Board voted to vacate the previous denial and approve the application.
