EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT – TIM VACCARO

Mr. Vaccaro gave the following report:

Mr. Vaccaro distributed stats from the Complaints Division, and explained those stats to the board members.

Mr. Vaccaro also informed the board members that if they are contacted directly by members of the general public, to pass that information along to him and to shred it.

Mr. Vaccaro also requested that if any board members had any problems with the probable cause schedule which had just been distributed, to please let him know and he would attempt to work things out.

With nothing further to report the board voted unanimously to approve this report.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – MICHELLE KANE

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT – PATRICK CREEHAN

Mr. Creehan gave the following report:

For the month of November 2004, the overall case load was 669, down from 782 in October 2004, and up from 665 in November of 2003.

The total number of cases waiting to be reviewed in Legal was 297. 37 cases had been set for probable cause, 101 cases where probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed, and 27 cases were ready for default. 47 cases had stipulations executed/informal hearings requested, 92 had requested formal hearings, and 8 cases had been referred to DOAH. 37 cases were awaiting final orders and 22 cases were in settlement negotiations. 1 case was under appeal and 0 cases had been reopened. For November 2004, 168 cases had been closed.

For the month of December 2004, the overall case load was 639.

The total number of cases waiting to be reviewed in Legal was 274. 27 cases were set for probable cause, 105 cases where probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed, and 39 cases were ready for default. 50 cases had stipulations executed/informal hearings requested, 96 cases had requested formal hearings, and 7 cases were referred to DOAH. 16 cases were awaiting final orders and 23 cases were in settlement negotiations. 1 case was under appeal and 1 case had been reopened.

With nothing further to report the board voted unanimously to approve this report.

RECOVERY FUND ATTORNEY'S REPORT – ADRIENNE RODGERS

Ms. Rodgers gave the following report:

As of December 31st, 2004, the Recovery Fund had dispursed or obligated \$1.1 million dollars. Approximately 227 claims had been received by the Recovery Fund, of which only 148 were legally sufficient. There was still 611 claims pending.

ATTORNEY GENERAL'S REPORT – DIANE GUILLETTE

WELL WATER SCOPE OF WORK PRESENTATION

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating the CILB voted to table a response to a scope of work letter regarding Water Well Contractor's licenses until January 2005. The scope of work request refers to subject matter that may be of interest to the ECLB, as well as the CILB. The scope of work requests clarification on whether or not an individual in possession of a Water Well Contractor's license issued by one of the Florida Water Management District Offices can act as a prime contractor on a job requiring the need to subcontract other work, such as electrical.

After discussion the board voted to continue this discussion at a later date.

FRACCA – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING

A representative from FRACCA, Ed Harris, was present.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating that Florida Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (FRACCA)'s continuing education course applications entitled, "Construction Insurance – Making the Numbers Work", "Reduce Workplace Conflict and Increase Your Bottom Line", "Death of Employee Loyalty", and "Death of Customer Loyalty", were all denied at the November 2004 meeting of the board for being sales related courses and not being sufficiently related to contracting. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in January of 2005. FRACCA timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion the board voted to uphold the denial.

JESSE BROCK – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING

Mr. Brock was present.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating that Mr. Brock's application for Initial Certified Residential and General Contractor (Grandfathering) was denied at the September 2004

meeting of the Board for having a delinquent family support obligation, and for having been disciplined in the past for construction related activity. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in December of 2004. Mr. Brock timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion the Board voted unanimously to approve this application.

DANIEL SCHERER – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING

Mr. Scherer was present with counsel Dennis Fountain.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating that Mr. Scherer's application for initial licensure as a certified general contractor was denied at the September 2004 meeting of the board for failing to provide proof of having his civil rights restored. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in October of 2004. Mr. Scherer timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion the Board voted unanimously to uphold the previous denial.

MAURICE SCOTT – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING

Mr. Scott was present with Attorney Pedro W. Rodriguez

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating that Mr. Scott's application for initial licensure as a certified Class B air conditioning contractor was denied at the September 2004 meeting of the board for failing to submit proof that his civil rights had been restored. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in October of 2004. Mr. Scott timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion the Board voted unanimously to uphold the denial.

GOODE BUDDY YOEMAN – PETITION FOR FORMAL HEARING

Ms. Yoeman was present with Attorney Tim Atkinson.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating that Mr. Yeoman's application for licensure was denied at the May 2004 meeting of the board for failing to provide proof to the board that his civil rights had been restored. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in June of 2004. Mr. Yeoman timely filed a Petition for Formal Administrative Hearing. A rule challenge as to the forms rule was also filed. Mr. Yeoman requested that the hearing not be set before the Board until the related rule challenge was resolved. DOAH abstained from ruling on the rule challenge as the rule had been previously repealed by legislative action. Mr. Yeoman then requested an informal hearing before the board.

After discussion the Board voted unanimously to uphold the previous denial.

DARYL ANNE MEANS – REQUEST TO REINSTATE THE STAY OF SUSPENSION

Ms. Means was not present. Some victims from the Ms. Means' cases were present and provided testimony.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating that Ms. Means petitioned the board to continue to accept restitution payments in installments and to reinstate the stay of suspension on the her license. A corrected final order approving the settlement stipulation was filed on February 24, 2004. Ms. Means was not in attendance and requested a 30 day continuance.

After discussion, the Board voted unanimously to deny the continuance and deny the reinstatement of stay of suspension. The Board voted to deny Ms. Means request to start making payments.

GREGORY APPELL – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING

Mr. Appell was present.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating Mr. Appell's application for initial licensure as a certified building contractor was denied at the November 2004 meeting of the board for failing to provide proof of the required experience. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in December of 2004. Mr. Appell timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion the board voted unanimously to uphold the denial.

WESLEY POWER – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING

Mr. Power was not present.

Ms. Guillemette presented this case stating Mr. Power's application for initial licensure as a certified general contractor was denied at the October 2004 meeting of the board for failing to have his experience properly verified. The Notice of Intent to Deny was filed in November of 2004. Mr. Power timely requested board reconsideration.

After discussion the board voted unanimously to continue the review for 30 days.

FRANKLIN WILSON – REQUEST FOR INFORMAL HEARING
