The meeting was called to order by Ms. Jacqueline Watts, former Chair, at 8:30 a.m. Mr. Hussey gave the invocation. Mr. Del Vecchio led the Pledge of Allegiance.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT – G.W. HARRELL

Mr. Harrell gave the following report:

Mr. Harrell mentioned an article that went national concerning unlicensed activity enforcement being performed by the Department. Mr. Harrell also brought up that Mr. Wilford is ill and still under the weather. Mr. Harrell also announced the departure of Amanda Abbott to another Division in the Department and recognized her services to the board over the past several years.

Mr. Harrell also announced a future nominating committee would be held in the near future and if any board members from Division I would like to volunteer themselves for Vice Chair to please let him know. He also mentioned that discussing it amongst themselves would be in violation of the Sunshine Law so make sure to discuss it only with Mr. Harrell.

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT – JEFF KELLY

Mr. Kelly gave the following report:

For August 2009 the overall case load was 1,831, up from 1,756 in August 2009, and down from 2,423 from August 2008.

There were currently 695 cases waiting to be reviewed in Legal, 26 cases set for probable cause, and 397 cases where probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed. 187 cases were ready for default, 25 cases had stipulations executed/informal hearings requested, and 101 cases had requested formal hearings. 24 cases were referred to DOAH, 53 cases were in settlement negotiations, 12 cases were awaiting final orders, and 308 cases were set for board presentation. 66 cases were closed in August 2009.

Mr. Kelly also announced the departure of a prosecuting attorney, Kyle Christopher.
