

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BOARD OF EMPLOYEE LEASING COMPANIES

I. General Information

II. Major Issues/Actions

- The Board reviewed ten initial licensure applications. Six applications were approved with contingencies and four applications were tabled pending receipt of additional information.
- The Board reviewed and approved one change of ownership application with contingencies.
- The Board reviewed and accepted two controlling person license relinquishments.
- The Board reviewed and approved eight company name changes.

III. Legislation/Rule Promulgation

- The Board's counsel reported that the amendments to Rule 61G7-10.0014, Florida Administrative Code, to clarify the requirements for evidence of workers' compensation coverage, have been noticed and will be filed for final adoption unless a request for hearing is filed.

IV. Action Required

- The Board's counsel is to file the above referenced rule amendment for final adoption after the time for requesting a hearing has lapsed without a hearing request.
- The Board's counsel and Ms. Lanza are to continue working together to draft language which licensees may utilize to attest that all leased employees in Florida have workers' compensation coverage as required by Rule 61G7-10.0014, F.A.C.
- The Board's counsel and Board staff are to work together to draft language notifying licensees that pending an opinion from the Division of Workers' Compensation, they may be required to obtain a workers' compensation policy that does not exclude leased employees, even if they are utilizing client-based policies.

- The Board's counsel and Board staff are to work together to draft language notifying controlling person applicants, whose applications have been approved by the Board contingent upon receipt of Florida Department of Law Enforcement and/or Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history reports, that their licenses may be issued upon receipt of a written statement in which they agree to appear before the Board should additional information be revealed on the criminal history reports.
