589 **61G18-16.003 Continuing Education Standards**

590

591 **Ms. Christie requested the Board update the following rule language to include all**  
592 **AVMA accredited schools of veterinary medicine.**

593

594 (1) The continuing education requirements outlined in Rules 61G18-16.001 and 61G18-16.002,  
595 F.A.C., may be complied with by attendance at approved scientific veterinary medical meetings. A  
596 licensed veterinarian shall receive credit for no more than five (5) hours of continuing professional  
597 education in business, practice management courses or stress and impairment seminars during any  
598 biennium period.

599 (2) Approved courses are deemed scientific if continuing education courses are provided by:

600 (a) National, State and International veterinary association meetings and Board meetings;

601 (b) Board Certified Specialties recognized by the AVMA;

602 (c) University of Florida, College of Veterinary Medicine sponsored courses, including clinical grand  
603 rounds, veterinary resident's seminars and Board specialty review sessions;

604 (d) The Registry of Approved Continuing Education Courses (RACE); and

605 (e) United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Veterinary  
606 Services.

607 (f) Any AVMA accredited school of veterinary medicine.

608 (3) Upon specific request, continuing education courses shall be approved by the Board whenever  
609 the courses provide additional current information with respect to the practice of veterinary medicine.  
610 Such requests shall include the following:

611 (a) A detailed course outline or syllabus;

612 (b) A current curriculum vitae of each speaker or lecturer;

613 (c) The procedure to be used for recording attendance; and

614 (d) The number of continuing education hours for which the course sponsor requests approval.

615 (4) Beginning on May 31, 2006, each provider, unless exempted by rule, shall be registered with the  
616 Board. The fee for such registration shall be \$200 and such registration must be renewed by May 31 of  
617 every other even numbered year.

618 (5) Course approval shall expire four (4) years from the date of approval. Continuing education  
619 providers shall reapply for approval of any course that has expired by complying with Rule 61G18-  
620 16.0035, F.A.C.

621

622 After discussion by the board the following motion was made.
