# Minutes of THE FLORIDA REAL ESTATE COMMISSION November 13 and 14, 2012 General Meeting

Chair Chip Boring called the meeting of the Florida Real Estate Commission to order, at approximately 8:30 a.m., in Orlando, Florida, on this 13<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2012.

The following Commission members were in attendance: Chair Chip Boring, Vice-Chair Roger Enzor, Richard DeNapoli, Darla Furst, Poul Hornsleth and Josh Podolsky. Mr. Tom Barnhart, Senior Assistant Attorney General, appeared as counsel for the Commission. Mr. Barnhart declared a quorum present.

### **Approval of the Minutes**

Commissioner Podolsky moved; seconded by Vice-Chair Enzor to approve the Minutes of the October 16 and 17, 2012, General Meeting, as written. The motion passed without dissent.

#### **Unlicensed Activity Report**

Director Watkins presented the Unlicensed Activity Report and addressed questions and comments from the Commission. Ms. Sarah Kimmig, Interim Bureau Chief, provided a summary report of the referral process to the Assistant State Attorney's Office. Ms. Watkins and Ms. Kimmig addressed questions and comments from the Commission.

### Report Regarding Enforcement Trends and Escrow Audits

Ms. Sarah Kimmig, Interim Bureau Chief presented the report regarding Complaint Trends and Escrow Audit Summary. Ms. Kimmig addressed questions and comments from the Commission.

### **Monthly Exam Performance Summary Report**

Director Watkins presented the monthly Exam Performance Summary Report and addressed comments from the Commission.

#### **Escrow Disbursement Orders**

Assistant General Counsel Joseph Solla presented 22 Escrow Disbursement Orders and 7 Orders for the Commission's consideration. Commissioner Hornsleth moved to accept the 22 Escrow Disbursement Orders and 7 Orders. Vice-Chair Enzor seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

### **Recovery Fund Claim**

### Tab A – Charzell Harmon and Norma Harmon v. Gracie Marla Buchwald, DBPR Case No. 2012042892

Ms. Buchwald was not present. Mr. Harmon was present and represented by Ms. Sherrie Dewitt, Esquire, also present. Assistant General Counsel Solla presented this matter to the Commission. Mr. Solla advised that the Claimant failed to satisfy the statutory requirements to receive payment from the recovery fund and recommended the Commission deny the request. The Commission considered the facts and circumstances. Vice-Chair Enzor moved to approve the order denying the claim. Commissioner Podolsky seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

#### Tab C – Vinay N. Patel and Nimisha Patel v. Arif Zaheer, DBPR Case No. 2009062729

Mr. Zaheer was not present. Mr. Hans Kennon, Esquire, appeared on behalf of the Claimant. Assistant General Counsel Solla presented this matter to the Commission. Mr. Solla advised that the Claimant qualifies statutorily to receive payment from the recovery fund and recommended the Commission approve the request. The Commission considered the facts and circumstances. Commissioner Hornsleth moved to approve the order granting the claim in the amount of \$50,000.00. Commissioner DeNapoli seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

#### Tab B - Carlos Eduardo Memoria v. Noelvis Gamez, DBPR Case No. 2012041348

There were no appearances on behalf of either party. Assistant General Counsel Solla presented this matter to the Commission. Mr. Solla advised that the Claimant qualifies statutorily to receive payment from the recovery fund and recommended the Commission approve the request. The Commission considered the facts and circumstances. Vice-Chair Enzor moved to approve the order granting the claim in the amount of \$19,500.00. Commissioner Podolsky seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

Mr. Cunningham represented the department and presented the case to the Commission. The Commission entered into discussion. Commissioner DeNapoli moved, seconded by Commissioner Podolsky to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment of License. The motion passed without dissent.

Action taken: Accepted Relinquishment of License for Permanent Revocation.

### Tab R – Domingo Montes De Oca, BK 316027 and 3216622, Case No. 2010035676 – Settlement Stipulation

Respondent was not present and represented by Daniel Villazon, Esquire, present. Commissioner Podolsky was recused due to participation on the probable cause panel.

Ms. Demartini represented the department and presented the case to the Commission. The Commission entered into discussion. Vice-Chair Enzor moved; seconded by Commissioner Furst to accept the Stipulated Settlement. The motion passed 4 to 1.

Penalty imposed: Suspension for 6 months; \$1,000.00 fine; investigative costs, shall complete an escrow management course and ethics course; shall attend one 2-day FREC General meeting. Violation: Section 475.25(1)(d)1, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to account and deliver, upon demand, funds that were required to be held in escrow by Respondent; Rule 61J2-14.012(2), Florida Administrative Code, by failing to prepare monthly reconciliation statements for Palm Properties' escrow account; Section 475.25(1)(k), Florida Statutes, by failing to place a deposit into Palm Properties' escrow account by the end of the third business day following receipt of the funds; Rule 61J2-14.012(3), Florida Administrative Code, when Respondent failed to describe or explain shortages reflected on the reconstructed reconciliation statements, and explain what, if any corrective actions were taken to remedy the shortages.

Action taken: Settlement Stipulation accepted.

Action taken: Settlement Stipulation accepted.

Commissioner Podolsky moved, seconded by Vice-Chair Enzor; motion passed without dissent to continue the matter until January 2013.

**Penalty imposed:** Revocation; investigative costs. **Violation:** Respondent violated Section 475.25(1)(d)1, Florida Statutes, when Respondent failed to account and deliver a real estate commission in which a civil judgment relating to the practice of the licensee's profession has been obtained against the licensee and said judgment has not been satisfied in accordance with the terms of the judgment within a reasonable time.

### Tab Y – Elizabeth Stout, SL 3057786, Case No. 2010012038 – Petitioner's Motion for Finding of Waiver and Enter a Final Order

Respondent was present and not represented by counsel. No current members were recused due to participation on the probable cause panel.

Ms. Roderick represented the department and presented the case to the Commission. The Commission granted the waiver hearing and entered into discussion. Commissioner Podolsky moved, seconded by Vice-Chair Enzor; motion carried unanimously to find the Respondent guilty as charged in the Administrative Complaint. Commissioner Podolsky moved, seconded by Commissioner Furst; motion passed without dissent to impose the following sanctions:

**Penalty imposed:** \$500.00; investigative costs; 6 months probation, must attend two 2-day FREC general meetings. **Violation:** Respondent violated Section 475.42(1)(d), Florida Statutes; Rule 61J2-14.009, Florida Administrative Code and 475.25(1)(e), Florida Statutes, when she failed to immediately forward both rent and the deposit for the Subject Property to her broker; Section 455.227(1)(j), Florida Statutes, and thereby Section 475.25(1)(e), Florida Statutes, by aiding, assisting, procuring, employing, or advising any unlicensed person or entity to practice a profession contrary to this chapter, the chapter regulating the profession, or the rules of the department or board.

### Tab C – Dawn Mazoch Funari, SL 704077, Case No. 2012027035 – Voluntary Relinquishment of License

Respondent was not present and not represented by counsel. There was no probable cause panel.

Ms. Royal represented the department and presented the case to the Commission. The Commission entered into discussion. Commissioner Hornsleth moved, seconded by Commissioner DeNapoli to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment of License. The motion passed without dissent.

Action taken: Accepted Relinquishment of License for Permanent Revocation.

**Penalty imposed:** \$250 fine, investigative costs, 6 months probation, must attend 1 two-day FREC general meeting. **Violation:** Respondent violated Section 475.25(1)(e), Florida Statutes, and thereby Section 475.42(1)(a), Florida Statutes, when Respondent contracted to assist a person in searching for a home to purchase and received compensation for his real estate services while his license was in an inactive status.

Respondent was not present and not represented by counsel. There was no probable cause panel.

### Tab W - Richard Jason Hannan, BK 3088243, Case No. 2012000443 - Petitioner's Motion for Finding of Waiver and Enter a Final Order

Respondent was not present and not represented by counsel. Commissioner Podolsky was recused due to participation on the probable cause panel.

Violation: Respondent violated Section 475.25 (1)(b), Florida Statutes(2011), when Respondent, through the actions of Respondent's broker, misappropriated clients' funds, which were required to be held in escrow; violated Section 475.25(1)(d)1, Florida Statutes (2011), when Respondent's broker failed to account and deliver, upon demand, funds that were required to be held in escrow by Respondent; violated Section 475.25(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2011), by failing to immediately place into escrow, funds entrusted to him as a broker.

Violation: Respondent violated Section 475.42(1)(b), Florida Statutes, when Respondent acted in the capacity of a Real Estate Broker for US Holidays Management Group, LLC, while being licensed by the Petitioner as a Real Estate Sales Associate, and registered with the Petitioner as a Real Estate Sales Associate for US Holidays Group Realty, LLC; Section 475.25(1)(b), Florida Statutes, having been guilty of fraud, misrepresentation, concealment, false promises, false pretenses, dishonest dealing by trick, scheme, or device, culpable negligence, or breach of trust in any business transaction in this state or any other state, nation, or territory; Section 475.25(1)(e), Florida Statutes, by violating Section 455.227(1)(j), Florida Statutes, by aiding an entity in the unlicensed practice of real estate.
