The Respondent was not present and was not represented by counsel. Ms. Bova represented the Department. Commissioner Ketcham served on probable cause and was recused.

After discussion, Commissioner Sanchez moved; seconded by Commissioner Butler; to find the Respondent guilty as charged in the Administrative Complaint; the motion passed without dissent. Commissioner Sanchez moved; seconded by Vice-Chair Schwartz; to impose the following sanctions: revocation; administrative fine of \$2,000.00; investigative costs of \$500.00; the motion passed without dissent.

Violation(s): Section 475.25(1)(e), Florida Statutes, through a violation of Section 455.227(1)(t), Florida Statutes, by failing to report in writing to the board or, if there is no board, to the department within 30 days after the licensee is convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to, regardless of adjudication, a crime in any jurisdiction; Section 475.25(1)(f), Florida Statutes, by being convicted or being found guilty of or entered a plea of nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a crime in which directly relates to the activities of a licensed broker or sales associate, or involves moral turpitude or fraudulent or dishonest dealing.

Tab B – Leticia Elejalde, SL3013710, Case No. 2020-029784 – Respondent's Request for Informal Hearing

The Respondent was not present and was represented by counsel, Mr. Hoss Hernandez, Esq., not present. Ms. Bova represented the Department. Commissioner Fitzgerald served on probable cause and was recused.

After discussion, Vice-Chair Schwartz moved; seconded by Commissioners Sanchez and Ketcham; to find the Respondent guilty as charged in the Administrative Complaint; the motion passed without dissent. Vice- Chair Schwartz moved; seconded by Commissioner Sanchez; to impose the following sanctions: revocation; administrative fine of \$3,000.00; investigative costs of \$1,584.00; the motion passed without dissent.

Violation(s): Section 475.25(1)(k), Florida Statutes, by failing to immediately place, upon receipt, any money, fund, deposit, check or draft entrusted to her or him by any person dealing with her or him as a

broker in escrow with a title company banking institution credit union or savings and loans association located or doing business in this state, or to deposit such funds in a savings and loans association located and doing business In this state, wherein that funds shall be kept until disbursement thereof properly authorized; or has failed, if sales associate to immediately place with her or his registered employer any money, fund deposit, check or draft entrusted to her or him by any person dealing with her or him as agent of the registered employer; Section 475.25(1)(d)1, Florida Statutes, by failing to account or deliver to any person, including a license under this chapter, at the time which has been agreed upon or is required by law or, in the absence of a fixed time, upon a demand of the person entitled to such accounting and delivery, any personal property such as money, fund, deposit, check, draft, abstract title, mortgage, conveyances, lease or other document or things of value; Section 475.25(1)(b), Florida Statutes, by being guilty of fraud, misrepresentation, and dishonest dealings, concealment, culpable negligence or breach of trust, or has formed an intent, design or scheme to engage in any such misconduct and committed an overt act in furtherance of such intent, design or scheme.

Tabs C – Constance Love, SL3398360, Case No. 2020-010186 – Petitioner's Request for Informal Hearing

The Respondent was not present and was not represented by counsel. Ms. Brennen represented the Department. Vice- Chair Schwartz served on probable cause and was recused.

After discussion, Commissioner Sanchez moved; seconded by Commissioners Barbara and Ketcham; to find the Respondent guilty as charged in the Administrative Complaint; the motion passed without dissent. Commissioner Sanchez moved; seconded by Commissioner Fitzgerald; to impose the following sanctions: revocation; administrative fine of \$2,000.00; investigative costs of \$1,039.50; the motion passed without dissent.

Violation(s): Section 475.25(1)(d)(2), Florida Statutes, by failing to deposit money in an escrow account when the licensee is the purchaser of real estate under a contract where the contract requires the purchaser to place deposit money in an escrow account to be applied to the purchase price if the sale is consummated; Section 475.42(1)(i), Florida Statutes, by placing, or causing to be placed, upon the public records of any county, any contract, assignment, deed, will, mortgage, affidavit, or other writing which purports to affect the title of, or encumber, any real property if the same is known to her or him to be false, void, or not authorized to be placed of record, or not executed in the form entitling it to be recorded, or the execution or recording whereof has not been authorized by the owner of the property, maliciously or for the purpose of collecting a commission, or to coerce the payment of money to the broker or sales associate or other person, or for any unlawful purpose. However, nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to prohibit a broker or a sales associate from recording a judgment rendered by a court of this state or to prohibit a broker from placing a lien on a property where expressly permitted by contractual agreement or otherwise allowed by law.

Tabs D – Joshua McAlees, SL3033004, Case Nos. 2020-033836 – Motion to Vacate Administrative Complaint

Violation(s): Section 475.25(1)(b), Florida Statutes, by being guilty of fraud, misrepresentation, and dishonest dealings, concealment, culpable negligence or breach of trust, or has formed an intent, design or scheme to engage in any such misconduct and committed an overt act in furtherance of such intent, design or scheme; Section 475.25(1)(d)1, Florida Statutes, by failing to account or deliver to any person, including a license under this chapter, at the time which has been agreed upon or is required by law or, in the absence of a fixed time, upon a demand of the person entitled to such accounting and delivery, any personal property such as money, fund, deposit, check, draft, abstract title, mortgage, conveyances, lease or other document or things of value.

Tab G – Kenneth Jensen, SL3255843, Case No. 2020-049348 – Respondent's Request for Settlement Stipulation

The Respondent was present and was represented by counsel, Mr. Kevin Griffith, Esquire, not present. Ms. Brennen represented the Department. Commissioner Sanchez served on probable cause and was recused.

After discussion, Vice-Chair Schwartz moved; seconded by Commissioner Ketcham; to accept the Settlement Stipulation: suspension for 90 days; administrative fine of \$250.00; investigative costs of \$651.75; 3-Hour Core Law Education; the motion passed without dissent.

After discussion, Commissioner Fitzgerald moved; seconded by Commissioner Ketcham; to accept the Settlement Stipulation: administrative fine of \$1,000.00; investigative costs of \$825.00; 28-hour Reactivation Course Education; 1 complete FREC Meeting; the motion passed without dissent.
